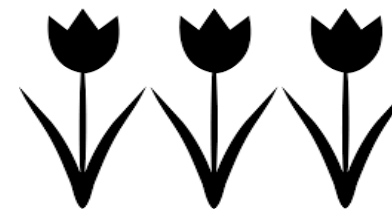

## Directions to the Quilt Show

Lourdes High School, 110 N Sawyer Street in Oshkosh, is on the northeast corner of Witzel Ave and Sawyer St. From Highway 41 take Exit #117 (9<sup>th</sup> Ave). Travel east on 9<sup>th</sup> Ave for 0.6 miles then turn left/north on Sawyer St. Travel 0.4 miles and turn right/east on Witzel Ave, then take the first left (Josslyn Ave) and enter at Door 7. Parking is available behind the school and on Josslyn.

## Quilt Judge—Allison Rainboth, NQA Certified

Allison Rainboth has been judging quilts for a number of years and was certified by the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ) in 2018. She loves the opportunity to encourage quilters by providing specific feedback. She has owned and operated Sisters Choice Quilting Service in Berlin since 2003, striving to provide her customers with quilting to suit their preferences. She is also known for her expertise with vintage and antique textiles. She travels widely to lecture at guilds, historical societies and other venues on Civil War quilts and other subjects related to 19<sup>th</sup> century quilts.

## Guest Speaker—Sheryl Schwochert

Sheryl has been an owner of The Sewing Basket in Plymouth since it opened in 1996. She has enjoyed watching the quilting world do a complete metamorphosis over the past 22 years. Many projects and techniques from the 90's are coming back with a modern twist for our next generation of quilters. Sheryl is a gadget girl, she loves finding a new notion or trying the latest technique and then helping other quilters to understand and use it in their own quilting projects. She also enjoys playing with the process of quilt design by twisting, turning, recoloring and resizing shapes into different patterns.

## 11 am – Panel Play

No two panels are the same, so no two panel-inspired quilt projects are the same. Join Sheryl on a tour through a suitcase full of projects from simply adding borders to cutting up the panel and incorporating it into a pieced project. This lecture is about finding inspiration, dealing with math challenges, and above all, keeping it fun!

A pile of t-shirts, now what? Sheryl will help us sort through them all, discussing the challenges of size, shape and texture, preparing the t-shirts for cutting and sewing, and then options for design and layout.

Pat is honored to be the featured quilter this year. She can't remember a time when she didn't sew, and sewing for her began on a treadle machine. Working in a fabric store and then owning a quilt shop has only broadened her love for and creativity with fabric. At the present time she's a longarm machine quilter and her other passion is designing bags of all kinds. Pat joined Lakeside Quilters Guild in 1996 and has made many friends who share her love of quilting. In her spare time she enjoys reading and gardening while also contemplating her next quilting project!

## 2019 Quilt Entry Rules and Information

1. Quilt entry forms must be postmarked no later than Friday, March 8, 2019.
2. Quilt entries must be delivered to Lourdes High School, 110 N Sawyer St, Door 7, in Oshkosh on Thursday, March 28, 2019, from 4:30-6:30pm.
3. All quilts are required to have a 4" deep sleeve, the width of the quilt at the top. The top of the sleeve should be no more than 90" from floor so longer quilts do not hang on the floor. Each entry must have a fabric label with the quilter's name attached to the back of the quilt.
4. Quilts previously entered in our biennial quilt show are not eligible.
5. Quilts must have been completed within the past 5 years.
6. Entrants are responsible for their own insurance.
7. Lakeside Quilters Ltd reserves the right to reclassify an entry and/or eliminate a class if too few items are entered.
8. Lakeside Quilters Ltd cannot accommodate special handling requests.
9. Quilts must be picked up between 4:30-5pm on Saturday, March 30, 2019. Claim checks must be shown when picking up quilts.
10. Attach a brief description about each quilt to the entry form including items such as: pattern/book

used, quilt title, who made the top, who quilted it, techniques used (e.g., needle-turn appliqué), year completed, who it was made for and why. Additional information can be included as well. Class F – Large (perimeter 251" or larger)

### Home or Long Arm Quilted Computer Assisted

Class G – Small/Medium (perimeter 250" or less)

Class H – Large (perimeter 251" or larger)

### Art Quilts\* – Class I

### Miniatures\*\* – Class J

### Wall Hangings (perimeter 200" or less) – Class M

### Wearables and Bags – Class N

\* An art quilt is an original exploration of a concept or idea rather than the handing down of a "pattern". It experiments with textile manipulation, color, texture and/or a diversity of mixed media. It uses fiber or a fiber-like material with one or multiple layers held together with stitches.

\*\*A miniature quilt is a smaller version of a full-size quilt. In other words, all elements of a miniature quilt (blocks, borders, sashing, etc.) should be reduced in size to a proportion that matches the size of the full-size quilt. Total perimeter of the quilt cannot be larger than 96" and no single side should be more than 24". If pieced blocks are used, they cannot be larger than 4" on any side.

\*\*\*Examples: Pillows, table runners/toppers, placemats, mug rugs, rugs, anything that lays flat on a table or on the floor.
